RECAP OF LAST GAME VS. JSERRA CATHOLIC

After a devastating loss at Orange Lutheran to open the Trinity League schedule, where they won the statistical battle, Santa Margarita Catholic found themselves in the same boat when hosting JSerra Catholic. The Eagles amassed 341 vards of offense in the first half, including 341 passing, but after a big first guarter and guite second, the two teams were knotted at 21-21 at half.

After surrendering a touchdown in the third and falling behind 28-21, SMC manufactured the eventual game-winning drive three minutes in the fourth quarter. Taurian Nash pushed through the line on a one-yard dive for the score. Eagles Coach Anthony Rouzier had a decision to make. With two PAT attempts blocked last game and one already on the night, he chose to go for two. The gutsy call paid off as QB Jaxon Potter threaded the needle and completed a strike to Kyle Brody to give SMC a 29-28 lead and ultimately the victory.

Potter was 37-of-44 (84.1%) for 416 yards and two touchdowns. He broke his own school record for completions in a game and registered his third career 400-plus yard effort. Receiver Emmett Mosley hauled in 14 receptions for 155 yards -- a career high and one touchdown. The 14 catches is tied for second in school history. The pair each enjoyed one of he best statistical games in school history.

Potter

- Passed the 400-yard plus passing yardage threshold for the third time in career (second of the season). Only the tenth 400-yard plus game in school history. Now ranks just one game behind all-time leader K.J. Costello.
- Broke his own school record for pass completions in a single game with 37.

Mosley

Hauled in 14 pass receptions for 156 yards and one touchdown. The 14 catches are tied for second-most in a single game in school history.

The defense was able to make plays and hold upstart JSerra down for the triumph on Homecoming Night. They stood with LB Jacob Bower collecting 15 tackles (2 for loss) and an interception. LeVar Talley notched a sack, while defensive backs Donovan Comestro and Blake Wilson each had 11 tackles. Ben Durham had multiple tackles for a loss.

The Eagles look to raise their league mark to 2-1 as they host Servite in the second of three home contests in a row. No. 1 Mater Dei follows.

HEAD COACH ANTHONY ROUZIER

Anthony Rouzier begins his third season as the Head Varsity Coach at Santa Margarita Catholic High School. Prior to taking the reigns of the program in the spring of 2021, Rouzier coached at SMC for three seasons, first serving as the linebacker coach and then as the Eagles' defensive coordinator. The path to Head Coach started on August 27, 2020 when Rouzier was named on an interim basis. On February 5, 2021, Rouzier was named fulltime Head Coach by school President Andy Sulick.

Rouzier played collegiately at the University of Connecticut in 2005. There he was the first true freshman walk-on to start in the Division-era of the school. He then transferred to the University of Massachusetts as a scholarship athlete and was a member of two Colonial Athletic Conference championships teams. In the classroom, Rouzier earned All-Academic All-Conference honors in 2007 and 2008.

After his collegiate playing days, in 2014, Rouzier coached at Amherst Regional High School (Massachusetts) where he started as the linebacker coach and was promoted to Defensive Coordinator mid-season. Rouzier then proceeded to coach the outside linebackers at Winston-Salem State University (North Carolina) in the spring of 2015. Shortly after that, he returned as a graduate assistant at his Alma Mater, the University of Massachusetts. There he worked with the defensive backs in 2015 and linebackers in 2016.

Rouzier then found his way to Europe to coach with the Hamburg Huskies of the German Football League. There, in 2017, he was the interim Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator. For his success, Rouzier was promoted to and accepted the Head Coaching position. Rouzier was also the Defensive Coordinator for the Under-17 Hamburg State All-Star team and worked with a recruiting service that helped European prospects earn Division 1 college scholarships in the United States. One of the other German coaches was current SMC assistant coach Sean Embree. It was Embree who convinced Rouzier that coaching at SMC would be worth his while and he soon found his way to South Orange County.

Born and raised in Massachusetts, Rouzier married his wife Elwira, who he met in Germany in 2018. He holds Juris Doctor and Master's of Business Administration degrees from Florida International University and a Bachelor's Degree in Journalism from the University of Massachusetts. He is the co-creator of a children's book and non-profit organization that promotes health and wellness.

Over the recent offseason, Coach Rouzier and his talented staff have developed an innovative approach to expand the depth and breadth of the program. These activities and processes include:

- Attraction of several high profile prospects via transfer
- Individual player participation in over 55 camps, showcases and events throughout the West
- Scheduling almost one dozen 7-on-7 passing tournaments and scrimmages between all levels of the program
- Conducting multiple offsite team building and leadership events
- Improvement of communication pipeline with a myriad of team information being offered and shared. For example: first-ever preseason team newsletter
- Development and support of dedicated student-produced media programming covering all aspects of the team

HALL OF FAME INDUCTION HONOREE: HARRY WELCH

Former SMC Head Coach Harry Welch Receives Two Prestigious Honors



Recently it was announced that former Santa Margarita Catholic Head Football Coach Harry Welch was elected to the CIF-Southern Section Hall of Fame -- a prestigious honor.

Additionally, in August, Welch was one of the one hundred players and 13 coaches whose names were unveiled as inductees in the inaugural class of the new California High School Football Hall of Fame. The permanent home for the Hall is located at a space inside the iconic Rose Bowl in Pasadena. The ribbon cutting ceremony will be conducted in November with the CIF-Southern Section Division I championship being

played there and the Rose Bowl stadium celebrating its 100th anniversary.

Welch, who spent the final four years of his coaching career with the Eagles, is one of the most successful coaches in California prep football history. In his twenty-five year span as a head coach, he won nine CIF-SS Championships, three

State Championships and coached seventeen Divisional Players of the Year. His career accomplishments included a 46-game winning streak, a 30-game winning streak and nine CIF sectional titles, including four-consecutive between 2006-09.

Welch won three state football titles in the five-year span from 2006 to 2011 -- in 2006 at Canyon High School (Canyon Country) (Division 1), in 2008 at St. Margaret's Episcopal (Small School Division IV) and in 2011 at Santa Margarita Catholic (Division I). Welch is the only coach in California history to win three state championships with three different schools.

Upon arrival at Santa Margarita Welch returned the program to greatness. His 2010 team finished 9-3. Then in 2011 the team finished 13-2 mark and ranked as high as No. 10 in the nation. The season culminated with a memorable 42-37 victory over Bellarmine (San Jose) in the CIF Division I State Championship game at the Home Depot Center.

During his tenure at SMC, many of Welch's teams were highly ranked on the local, state and national levels. He finsihed his Eagle coaching career with a 35-14 record (.714). Welch was named the 2009 and 2010 Orange County Coach of the Year by the *Orange County Register* and 2010 Coach of the Year by the *Los Angeles Times*. In 2007, the California Coaches Association, an organization that includes high school, college, and NFL coaches, named him Coach of the Year. At the end of the 2009 season, the *Los Angeles Daily News* selected him as their Football Coach of the Decade. He was also named the 2011 ABC 7 Southern California NFL High School Coach of the Year.

Welch ended his remarkable coaching career with 256 victories, 60 losses and 2 ties -- an .808 winning percentage which is reportedly second-best in California history among coaches with 250 career wins.

The old adage in sports, especially football, is that it's difficult to defeat the same team a second time around. That was exactly the case for Servite (Anaheim) as they hosted a hungry Santa Margarita Catholic team in the CIF-SS Division 1 quarterfinals. For 40 minutes SMCHS battled with state No. 3 Servite nearly to-to-toe. The Eagles dominated the game with physicality as they were still making effective gains into Friar territory when the wheels fell off. What was a 13-3 game at that point became a 34-3 final in the span of the final eight minutes. sophomore Nasir Wyatt are three other key defenders. The defense lost junior linebacker Tanner Williams to a seasonending knee injury, putting more focus on the Monarchs' playmaking on defense.
